



## **SVVSD Learning Technology Plan**

### **Parent/Guardian Expectations and Commitments**

This document outlines the expectations for you, as part of the St. Vrain Valley School District (SVVSD) Learning Technology Plan (LTP), as well as the commitments SVVSD will honor to ensure the highest quality learning opportunities with technology for your child.

Parents/Guardians are expected to familiarize themselves with the LTP - Student Expectations, which can be found on your school's LTP website. Below are additional Expectations and Commitments revolving around technology in the home.

The devices referenced in these Expectations and Commitments are those specifically assigned to a student - currently an iPad mini, case, charger, and USB to Lightning cable.

### **Addendum to Student Expectations and Commitments:**

#### **Section 6: Technology in the home**

1. Your school and SVVSD commit to providing educational opportunities for interested Parents/Guardians.
  - a. Online resources, information, and updates about the program can be found on the school's LTP website.
  - b. An orientation will be held to provide information about the LTP and to distribute devices on a date and time to be determined by your school.
  - c. Optional additional learning opportunities for parents may be available through SVVSD and your school. Information about these offerings will be communicated through your school.
2. It is expected that Parents/Guardians be proactive in establishing home guidelines around appropriate use regarding student access to adult-themed websites and materials as well as Internet safety.
  - a. The SVVSD filter does not work outside of SVVSD buildings. You are encouraged to set boundaries, safeguards, and expectations for technology use at home that align with your family values. You can find information on restrictions, family limits, and filtering on your school's LTP website.
  - b. The device provided to your child is intended to be an instructional tool. You should ensure that it is accessible for school work at home, but are encouraged to set healthy time limits for home use.
  - c. You have the right to monitor your student's use of the device.
3. It is expected that Parent/Guardians be proactive in ensuring their student and the device are ready for academic use.
  - a. Please reference Section Six of the LTP - Student Expectations and Commitments document.
4. The device is considered a learning tool for all family members.
  - a. Parents/Guardians and other siblings are encouraged to use the device to supplement their learning, provided the student assigned the device has priority for their school work.
